Challenge: "Spatial planning was not in the position to react on the socioeconomic changes of the last 20 – 30 years. So how should spatial planning take into account unknown changes of the future?"





- Position of spatial planning
- Regional/ national spatial planning should be strenghened
- A very strong position of communal spatial planning is in danger to be dominated by individual interests of privat persons
- A clear legal framework is necessary





- Interdisciplinary cooperation
- Officials for natural hazards and spatial planning are seperated in different administrations, often sectoral thinking is dominating
- "Everybody knows, what the others should do"
- Interdisciplinary cooperation and broad communication is essential
