WHAT'S ESC?





ESC – European Solidarity Corps is funded by Erasmus+ and it is a partnership between two promoting organisations. These organisations are responsible for recruiting volunteers for their project. Volunteers participate in ESC through a "Sending Organisation" in the country where they live and a "Receiving Organisation" that hosts them during their time of service. The project can last up to 12 months, for example from September 2023 until September 2024, but we are a bit flexible regarding the start and end date. As a volunteer at CIPRA International in Liechtenstein you will work in the field of sustainable development and social innovation in an international setting. You will support our project managers in alpine wide projects and communication work.

You will live in Liechtenstein and receive free accommodation, insurance, pocket money for food and other expenses, bus ticket in Liechtenstein and support for the travel costs to and from Liechtenstein.

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Since you will work in the field of sustainable development and social innovation in an international setting, you should first and foremost be interested in these topics.

We prefer if you already have **some experiences in project work**, such as volunteering for a local club. We appreciate if you are fluent in English and have knowledge in German, as German is our working language. We also offer to pay for a German course to strengthen your language skills.
