



Workshop "Bringing the Alps to Expo 2015: mountains, food, environment and culture on the way to Milano"

Gorizia, 20 March 2014 9 am -1.00 pm

The Alps are renown to store a unique ecosystem and show a rich biodiversity that represents one of the main assets on which their historical as well as future development can be built - especially if a genuine Alpine Green Economy is a substantive goal for the region.

Regional diversity is mirrored in specific resources, practices and landscapes that can play either a direct or an indirect role in steering regional growth processes, whose relative dimension is highly variable and subject to volatility.

The central importance of food plants biodiversity in the Alps is testified by the cultural heritage still perceivable in the region concerning ancestral habits and traditional farming products.

Often, an impressive cultural meaning is attached to traditional farming products and local cuisine - that it is worth to recognise, preserve but also enhance as an innovative driver of the regional economy, where farming has ever been played a central role.

Expo 2015 will be a unique universal event displaying tradition, creativity and innovation in the business of food. It will bring together and cover the themes of food and sustainability and deal with the delicate equilibrium with sustainability needs in light of new global possibilities. Common core is that everyone on the planet should have access to food that is healthy, safe and sufficient.

The workshop aims at illustrating some promising practices developed in mountain regions, showing their potential to improve regional economic performance, discussing a few interesting experiences and defining a path to bring this impressive and unique set of experiences to EXPO Milano 2015 aiming at giving Alpine heritage and products a global visibility.




