Background and purpose of the workshop

The economy in the Alps shall become greener! The <u>sixth Report on the State of the Alps</u> defines key aspects for this purpose. Accordingly, a Green Alpine Economy should be

- low-carbon as well as energy and resource efficient,
- based on ecosystem services and natural capital and
- foster quality of life and well-being.

Based on the results of the RSA6, the XIVth Alpine Conference, held in 2016 in Grassau (Germany), decided on the elaboration of an ambitious and comprehensive Action Programme for Green Economy in the Alps. Thereby, the transformation process in the Alpine region will be supported and the basis for specific measures, projects and actions will be created. Local and regional actors play a crucial role for the preparation of the Action Programme. A series of workshops with various thematic priorities will be held in autumn 2017 to involve relevant stakeholders in shaping the future of Alpine Green Economy.

Plenary discussion and presentation of the results from group work

#### How it works

The workshop will be interactive and all participants will have the opportunity to play an active role in shaping its results: after listening to a presentation about the Sixth Report of the State of the Alps (RSA6) and to the presentations of the key note speakers, the participants will be divided in 8 groups, according to their work position: public administrators, legislators, entrepreneurs in the agricultural or touristic sectors, academics, investors, journalists and civil society. One student per group will have the role of observer.

The participants will be asked to contribute to define what innovation is and how it can be measured in the sectors of mountain farming and mountain tourism, according to the participants' role and background. At the end, taking into account real needs that have been raised during the workshop, an open debate among the different groups will take place. The aim of this open discussion is to define one common action for the sector of mountain farming, and one for mountain tourism, in order to give concrete support for the preparation of the Green Economy Action Programme and facilitate its implementation.

From Milan (150 km circa): Motorway A4 Milano-Venezia take the exit at Seriate, follow the signs for Brescia, then Lovere along the Val Cavallina and then for Darfo – Boario Terme – Breno – Edolo;

From Brescia (100 km circa): follow the signs for Lake Iseo, and then for Darfo – Boario Terme – Breno – Edolo

From Trentino: Follow the Valle di Non S.S.  $n^{\circ}$  43 , drive through Val di Sole and continue to Tonale Pass, and Ponte di Legno, then follow to Edolo

From Lake Como: take the S.S.  $n^{\circ}$  38 in the direction of Sondrio, turn right in Tresenda, turn right in the direction of Aprica along the S.S.  $n^{\circ}$  39.
