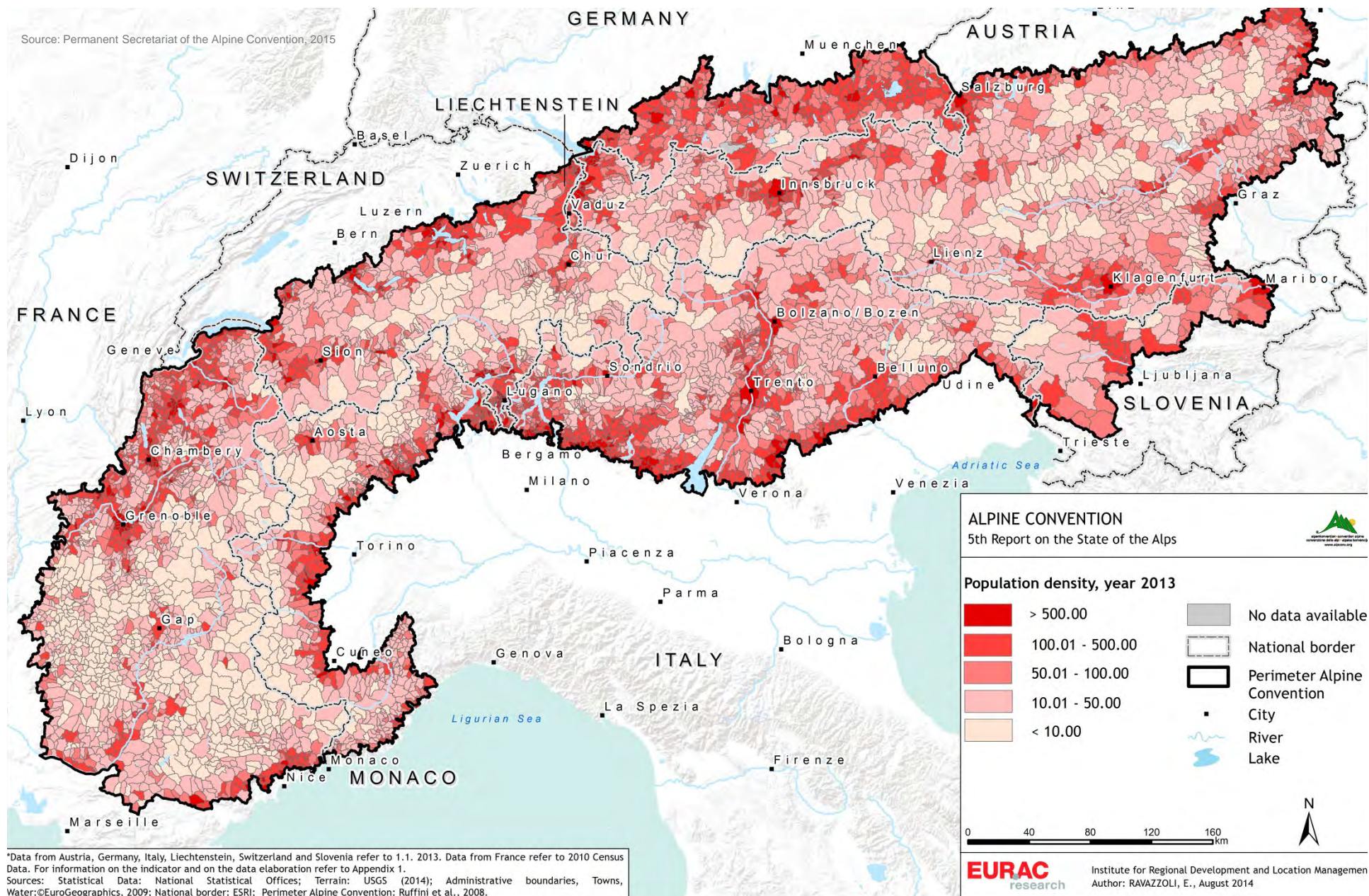

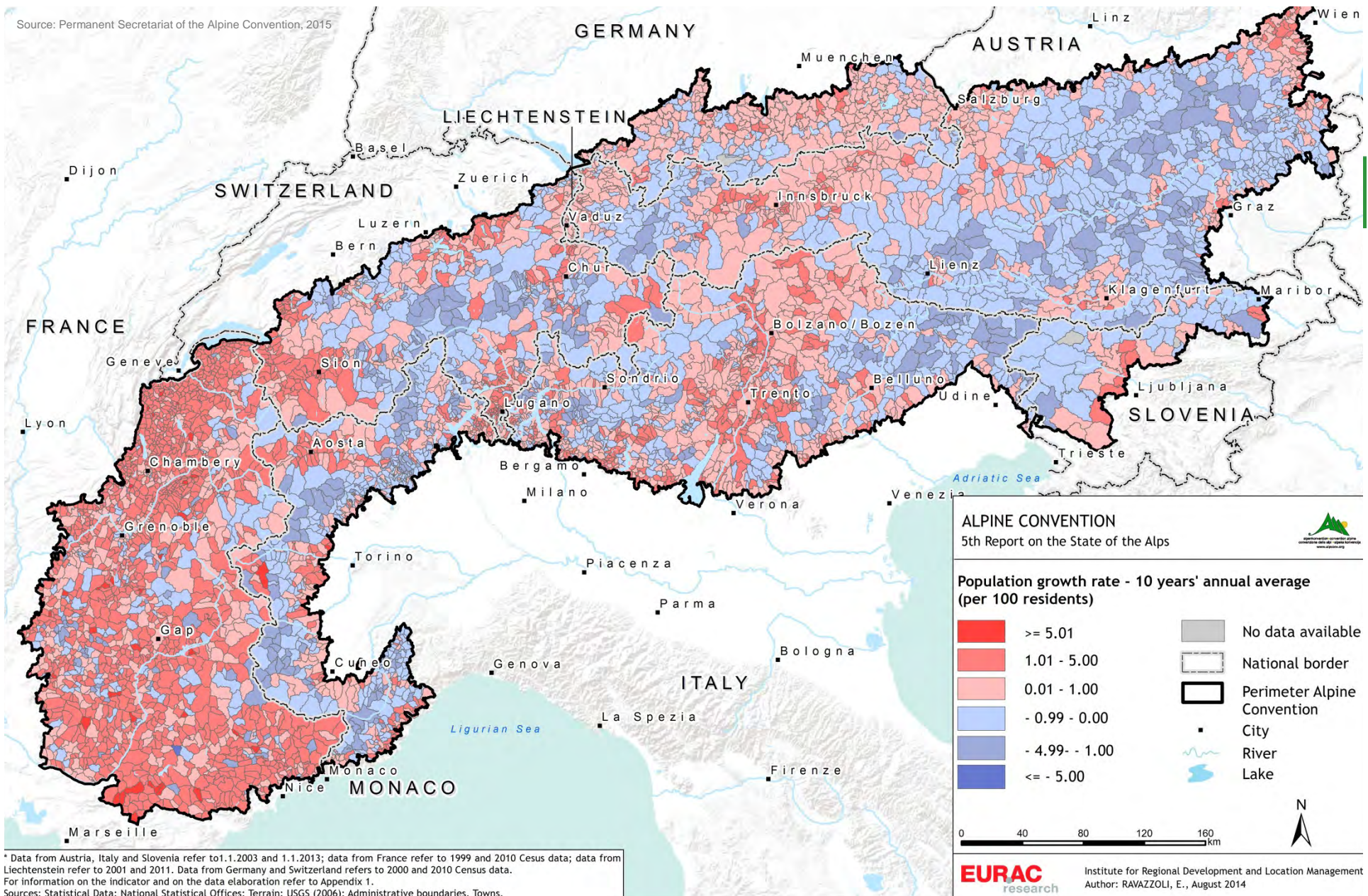

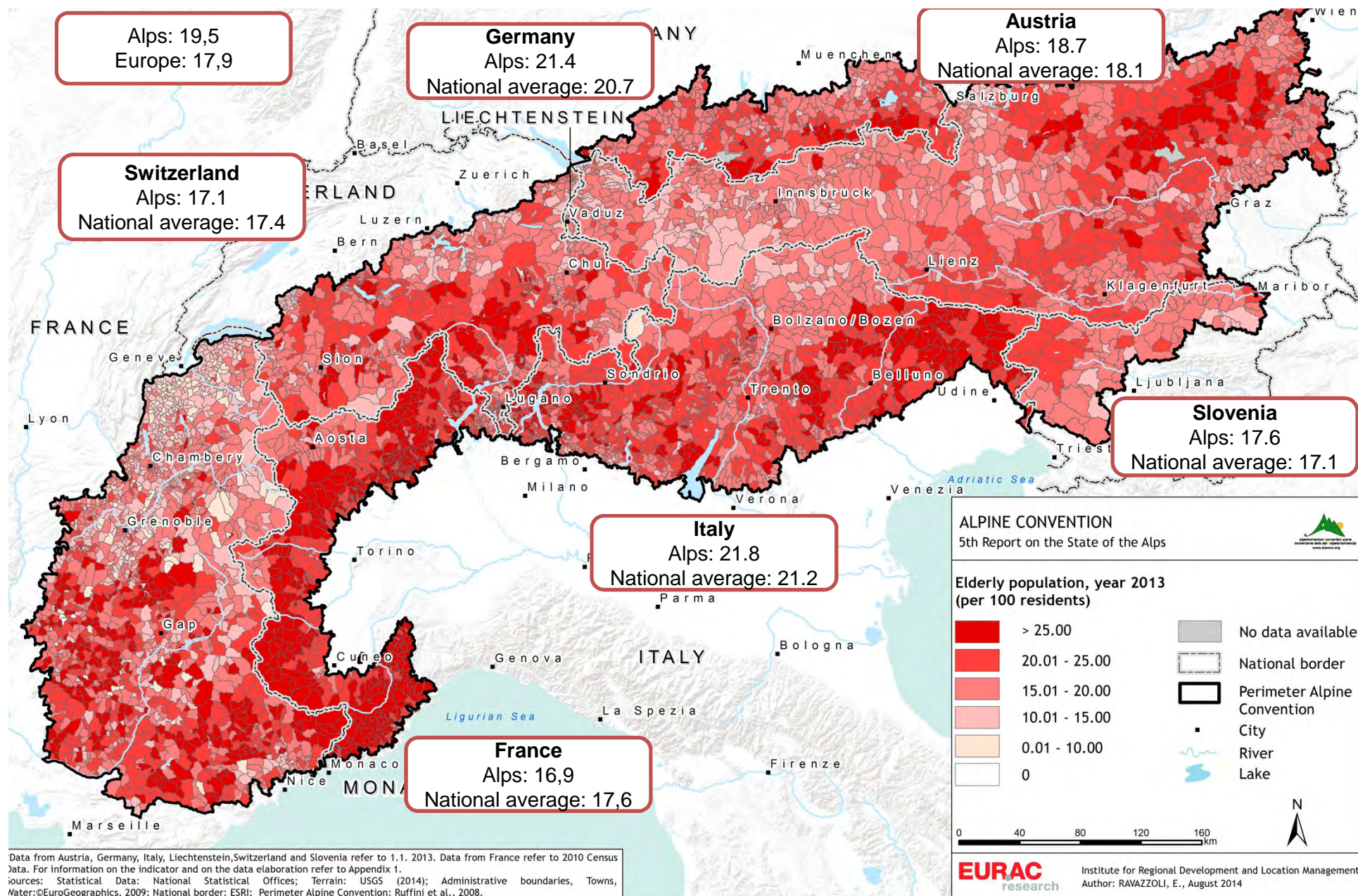




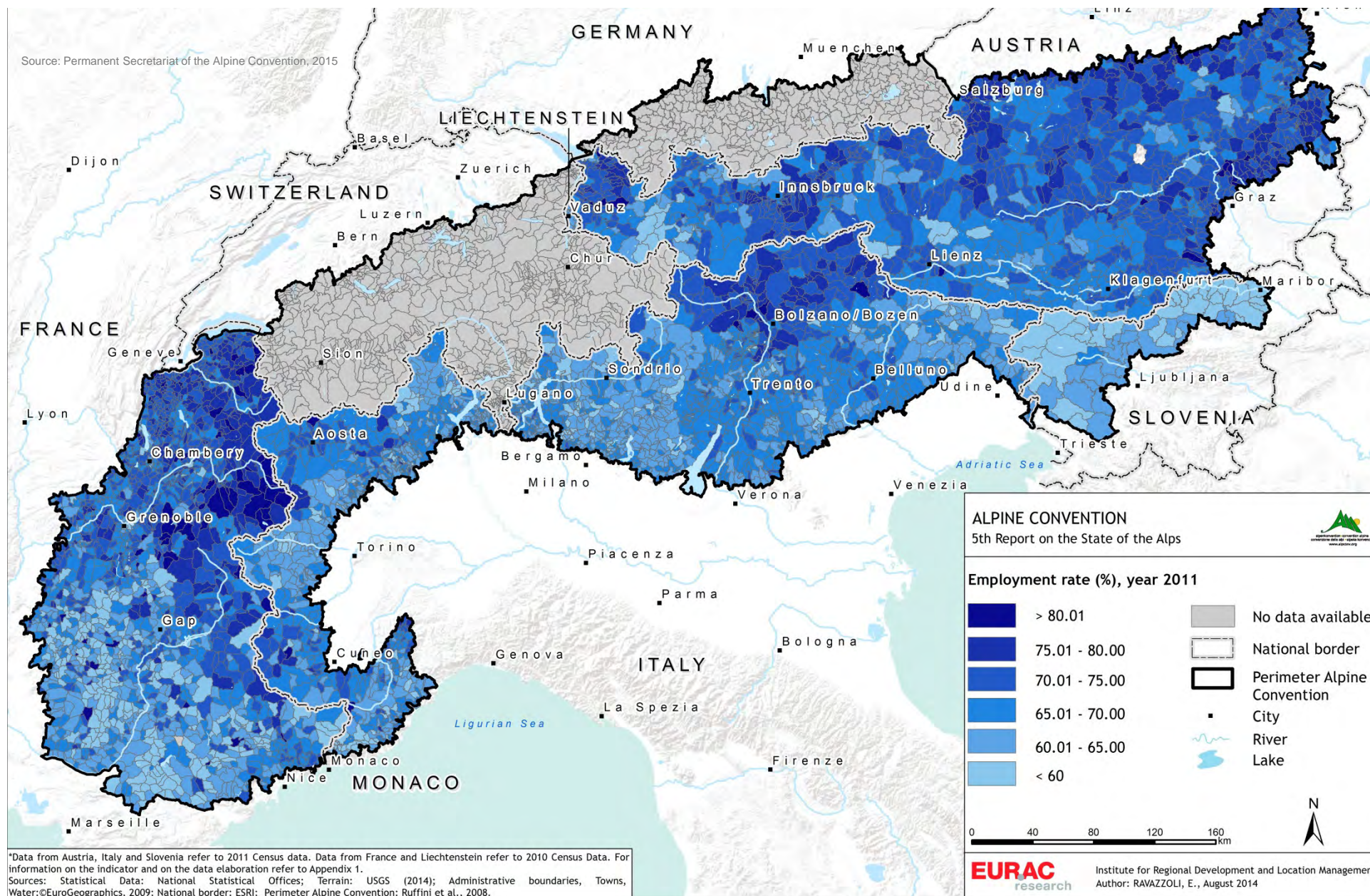

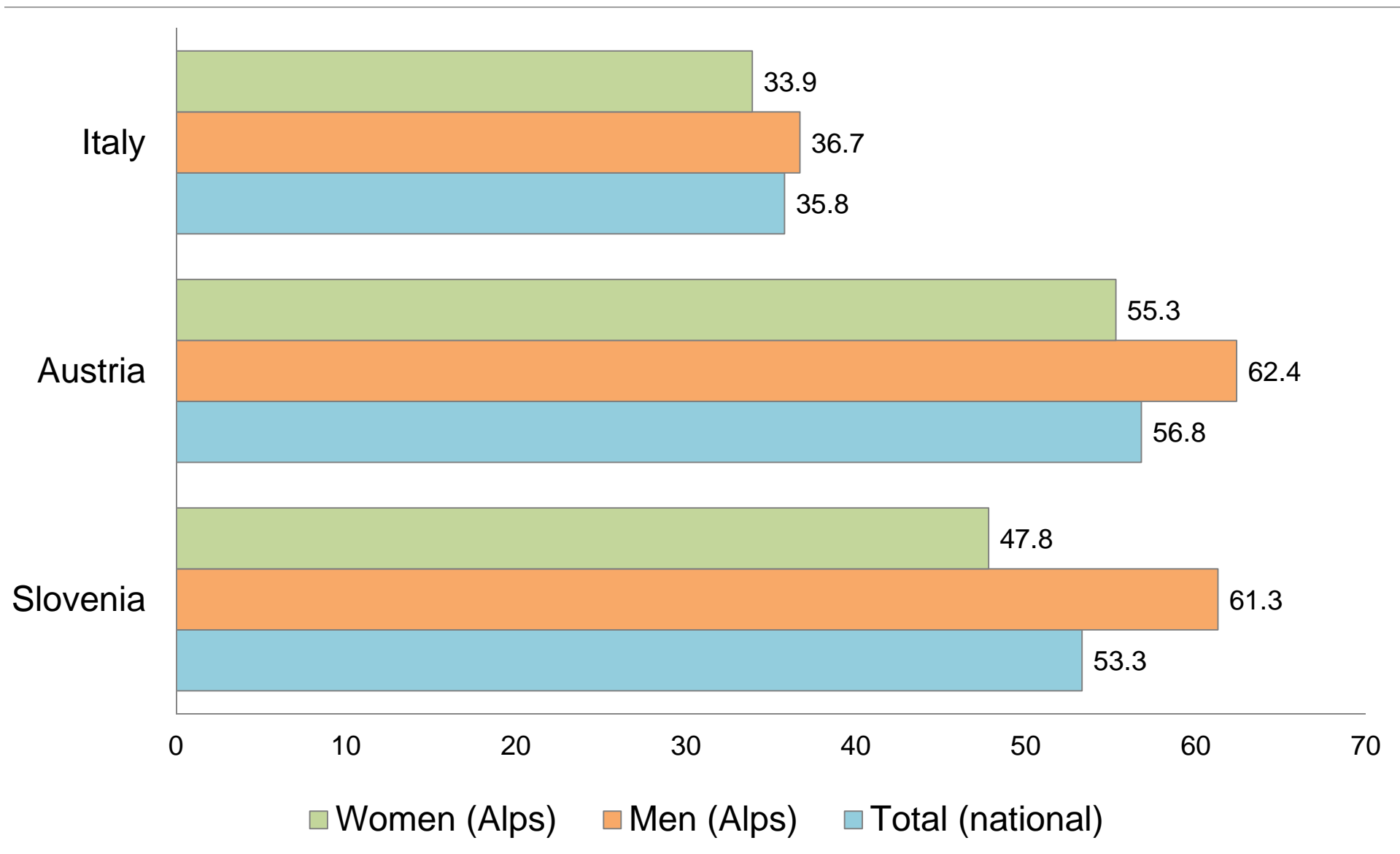
2) Growth and decrease coexist



3) The Alps are ageing

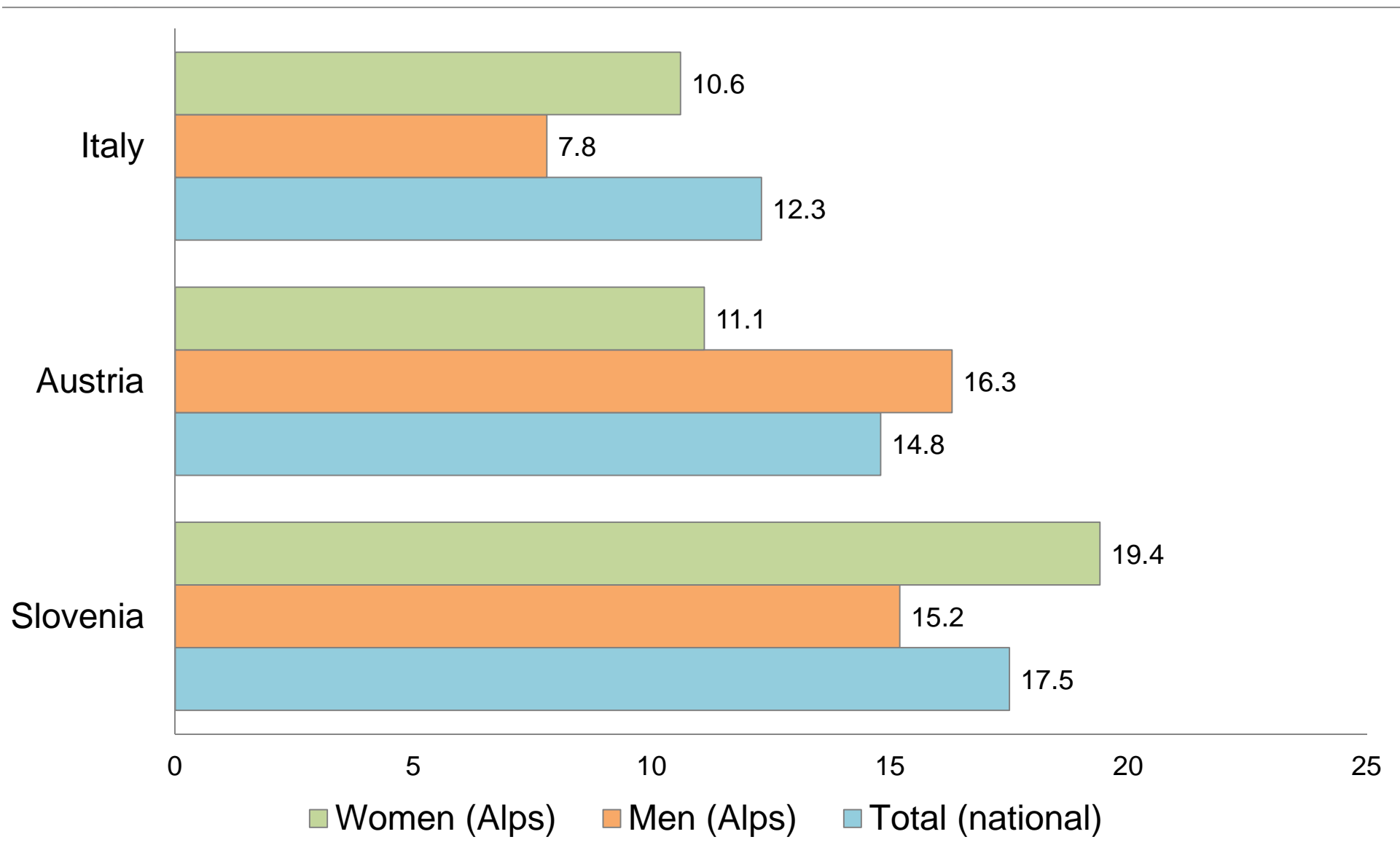


4) Employment: intra-alpine specificities
